



Updated: May 1, 2020

Dear Marin Council Scouting Volunteers,

As progress continues in limiting the spread of the Coronavirus (COVID-19), local, state, and federal agencies have updated their guidance related to what members of the public can do to protect themselves as well as steps we can all take to attempt to mitigate the impact this virus will have on society as a whole. We would ask all our Marin Council families to be aware of those governmental advisories and to please follow them. Council leadership is following the guidance of our local and state health departments.

**Effective Tuesday, March 17, 2020, the health departments from the six Bay Area counties began instructing residents to shelter in place. That order has been extended to May 31, 2020.**

**Scout Units are to suspend in-person meetings and events:**

- Effective March 17, 2020 through May 31, 2020, all public and private gatherings of any number of people occurring outside a household or living unit are prohibited.
- Scouting units should postpone all meetings or events scheduled between now through May 31, 2020.
- Scouting Units can meet “virtually” through Zoom or other platforms.
- Individual Scouts should continue to work on advancement either with a parent or online with a leader.
- Youth Protection Guidelines for online meetings are to be adhered to.

**Marin Council Offices and Trading Post will close on March 17, 2020. We will reopen June 1, 2020:**

- Marin Council Staff (Michael Dybeck, Nancy Rozell, Michael Andrews) will be working remotely during this time period and can be reached via email. We ask your patience related to the limitations in our service due to remote access.
- Camp Tamarancho and Camp Marin Sierra will not be available for use during this time period.
- We are committed to robust Summer Camp programs and trust that the measures we take now will contain the spread of COVID-19 virus. Should it be the case that camp operations are curtailed this summer, refunds will be issued. However, until that time we ask units to continue to prepare for camp and file appropriate summer camp reservations and camp payments.
