## Wood Badge is a 6-day course held over 2 weekends

Both weekends will be at Camp Tamarancho:

**Friday - Sunday,  
August 24 - 26, 2018 & Sept. 14 - 16, 2018**

Participants must be on site (in uniform) and ready to begin no later than 8:30 a.m. on Friday, August 24 and 8:30 a.m. on Friday, September 14. Arrangements can be made to spend the night previous to the start of each weekend. All participants must have Part A, B & C of the current BSA Medical Form in order to attend.

**COST:** Fee for the course is \$250 if paid prior to May 31st, 2018 (\$275 thereafter). The course fee may be paid in installments. A \$75 deposit will hold your place. If unable to attend, your deposit will be refunded if you notify Marin Council in writing before July 24, 2018.

Course fees cover training materials, food, and equipment for the entire course as well as a course shirt and hat. The only equipment you will need is your personal camping gear, tent, and clothing. A detailed list will be provided.

This leadership training could cost thousands of dollars if you were to take this training through your employment.

Wood Badge consists of two parts. The first part is a six-day experience where you will spend time at Scout camps learning leadership skills in order to better serve your BSA unit. These skills are also invaluable to all aspects of your Scouting, business and personal life.

During the second part, (the 18 month following the 6-day experience), participants work on their personal goals made during the six days. Upon successful completion of Wood Badge, Scouters receive their beads of recognition.
